Who are we?

Search and Rescue Services Limited (SRLS) operate 8 Bases with a fleet of 10 BK 117's and one H145 T2 covering the Central and Southern North Island of New Zealand. You will join a whānau family of enthusiastic and experienced Pilots, Crewmen and Critical Care Flight Paramedics who provide an essential life-saving service to our local communities.

Our role encompasses providing the highest level of clinical care to many of our most vulnerable communities within Aotearoa New Zealand, and as such we are committed to the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi and improving health equity and access particularly for the many Māori communities we serve.

As a dedicated government contracted EMS Helicopter provider, we operate on a 24/7, 365-day basis. Flexibility is needed to meet this requirement and you will have to commit to working both 24-hour shifts (on an on-call basis) and 12 hour shifts on-site.

Ko wai mātou?

Ko 'Ratonga Rapu kia Rauora' mātou, ā ka whakahaeretia e 8 ngā pokapū, kotahi 10 ngā toparere BK 117 me tētehi atu toparere H145T2 kia taea ai te toro atu ki te waengapū me te taha tonga o Te Ika-ā-Māui. Ka hono koe ki tētehi whānau rikarika, tokomaha ngā paerata mātanga, he ringa pūkenga, he manapou hoki hai whakarauora i ngā hapori. Ko tā mātou mahi he haumanu i ngā hapori paraheahea o roto o Aotearoa, ka mutu e ū ana mātou ki ngā mātāpono o Te Tiriti o Waitangi, kia whakapai ai te hauora o ngā hapori Māori huri noa. Ka mutu kia whakaōrite ai te mana taurite ki ngā ratonga hauora.

Nā te mea he ratonga toparere mā te kāwanatanga, ka mahia ngā mahi i ngā haora e 24 o ngā rā e 7 o te wiki, mō ngā rā e 365 o te tau. E tika ana kia pīngore te tangata e tutuki ai te haepapae, nā reira me ngākau titikaha koe kia mahia mō te 24 haora [he mahi ā-karanga], kia mahia hoki mō te 12 haora i te wāhi mahi.

Do you currently hold your Bachelor of Health Science Degree in Paramedicine and you're on the Post Graduate pathway, looking for a new challenge? Have you considered a role with Search & Rescue Services Ltd as a Critical Care Flight Paramedic? Search & Rescue Services Ltd is looking for people who are current Intensive Care Paramedics or Paramedics that have either completed their PGCert or PGDip or are currently undertaking this process. We would like to offer you an internship pathway through to the Critical Care Flight Paramedic authority to practice. Not only will you be providing aeromedical patient care, but you will also see and experience some of the most amazing and challenging parts of our country, making this role one of the most diverse in the paramedic industry.



This will be an internship of between 6 – 12 months, depending on your current ATP and experience, and you will be mentored across one or two of our bases, giving you the exposure that you require to achieve your ATP. Once you have successfully completed your internship, further specialist continuing development will also be provided. Upon successful completion of your internship, gaining your CCFP ATP, you will be offered a Critical Care Flight Paramedic role at one of our bases. The applicable bases can be advised to you at the beginning and may require a one- or two-year bonding.

Tō Tohu Mātauranga

Kei a koe he tohu mātauranga haumanu ohotata, e whai ana rānei i tō tohu paerua, ka mutu e rata ana ki te whakapātaritari? Kua āta whakaaro koe mō tētehi tūnga ‘Rapu kia Rauora’ hei Pou Manapou i te waka rererangi?

E kimi tāngata ana mātou o ‘Rapu kia Rauora’ nō roto o te hunga Manapou kua whakawhiwhia ki tana PGCert rānei, PGDip rānei, ka mutu ka aro hoki ki te tangata e whai ana i aua tohu mātauranga. Ka tukua ki a koe he tauira mahi e kake ai koe ki te tūnga Critical Care Flight Paramedic.

Ko āu mahi he tiaki tūroro ā-waka rererangi, engari kitea ai rongohia ai hoki e koe te nuku whenua me ūna piki me ūna heke katoa, nā konā i kīia ai he mahi kanorau mīharo tēnei o roto o te ao manapou.

E 6 marama tae atu ki te 12 marama te roa o tēnei tauira mahi, mā tō ATP me ū whēako e whakarerekē ai, ka mutu ka arahina koe e ētehi kei ngā wāhi mahi, mā reira e taunga ai koe ka eke ai ki te taumata ATP. Kia tutuki pai i a koe tāu mahi tauira, he huarahi anō e tū ana kia whiwhi ai koe i ētehi akoranga mātanga. Kia oti pai tō mahi tauira, me te whakawhiwhia ki a koe tō CCFP ATP, ka tonoa koe kia tū hei Critical Care Flight Paramedic i tētehi o ngā wāhi mahi. I te tīmatanga o tāu mahi ka whākina atu aua wāhi mahi, ka mutu he herenga pea mō te kotahi tau rānei, mō ngā tau e rua rānei.

Ko tā te Ratonga ‘Rapu kia Rauora’ he tiaki pai i te hunga tūroro me ngā whanau kia tōmua ai tōna haumaru, e tupu ai hoki te whakapono kāore he tiakitanga i tua atu huri noa i Aotearoa. E ū ana mātou ki Te Tiriti o Waitangi, ki te kanorau ā-ahurea, ki te urutanga ūrite. Whakatenatena ai kia whiwhi tono i te hunga nō wāhi kē, nō ahurea kē. Ka aro atu ki ngā mahi kua mahia, ki ngā tohu mātauranga kua whakawhiwhia, ka mutu e whakapono ana mātau ko te mea nui o tēnei ao, ko te tangata me ūna tini āhuatanga, nā reira ka aro ki te angatakitahi me tana kete whēako. Ka whakamiha atu ki te mana o ia tangata ahakoa nō hea nā runga i te whakapono he painga o roto o te tini tirohangā atu ki te ao, ka mutu he pērā hoki te hapori, he hapori kanorau.
