Primary objective

The Chief Paramedic Officer provides professional leadership, system-wide strategic direction, workforce planning, and expert advice for Paramedics, Paramedicine services, and prehospital care across the Northern Territory.

Key duties and responsibilities

1. To provide expert advice to the System Manager and act as a thought leader for strategic development of NT centric, contemporary prehospital services focused on optimisation of air, ground, and maritime medical responses, retrievals, and primary healthcare system enhancement.
2. Lead and participate in implementation and continuous quality improvement of Paramedicine practice for patient care in pre-hospital, out-of-hospital, and in-hospital environments to ensure high quality value-based healthcare outcomes, patient safety, and cultural responsiveness.
3. Assess opportunities to design and modernise models of care, credentialing, scope of practice, and clinical governance for Ambulance Paramedics, Remote Area Paramedics, Extended Care Paramedics, and Critical Care Paramedics, operating within NT Health service areas.
4. Conceptualise and evolve Paramedicine in areas of special interest across other NT government agencies (e.g. wilderness, rescue, and tactical medicine).
5. Represent the NT on national and jurisdictional committees and working groups in relation to national health reforms, strategies, workforce planning, digital health, clinical governance, and quality improvement strategies as it relates to the Paramedicine profession.
6. Assess opportunities with relevant training/educational institutions to lead educational and training strategies to equip Paramedics with extended skills required to contribute to multidisciplinary teams within NT Health.
7. Follow defined service quality standards, work health and safety policies and procedures relating to the work being undertaken in order to ensure high quality, safe services and workplaces.
8. Foster a positive workplace culture through exemplary leadership practices and role modelling behaviour.

Selection criteria

Essential

1. Professional qualifications as a Paramedic, with current registration with the Paramedicine Board, Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA).
2. A proven capacity to provide strong professional leadership, vision, and a contemporary approach to Paramedicine strategies, directions, and priorities with a global context.
3. Relevant extensive experience in pre-hospital care, particularly within multi-disciplinary teams, and resource limited and very remote settings.
4. Demonstrated experience in aeromedical and ground-based emergency response, rescue, and retrieval in a variety of settings and environments.
5. In-depth understanding of Aboriginal health care, Population and Primary Health Care, and Cultural Safety and Responsiveness
6. Sound knowledge of current and emerging health issues for the NT and their relationship with key strategic directions of the department and government.
7. High level communication skills, including experience in providing authoritative technical advice to senior executive management to effectively negotiate outcomes within a politically sensitive environment.
8. Highly developed interpersonal skills and with capability to operate effectively in a complex, cross-cultural, and politically sensitive environment; experience in developing, building, and maintaining effective networks with a range of internal and external stakeholders.

Desirable

1. Relevant post graduate qualifications
2. Extensive NT/remote location experience.
